The nature of being Canadian is explored in an exhibition that opens Friday at SAGA Public Art Gallery.

How we view the world, earn a living, spend our leisure time and how we interact with our environment are all unique to the people north of the 49th parallel.

“Being North” is a selection of works by fine arts undergraduate students from Thompson Rivers University.

The exhibition is cu-

rated by the students themselves, and consists of 12 multi-media works.

An opening reception will be held at 7 p.m. Friday and the exhibit runs to March 29. On Thursday, March 20 at 2:15 p.m., there will be a talk and tour where visitors can learn more details about each individual piece. Admission is by donation. Gallery hours are Tuesday to Saturday from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.
